UK Farm has been producing fresh goat's milk since 2003, and in 2006, UK Farm received HACCP and HALAL certification for its high-quality goat's milk.

We're delighted to tell you about the fantastic time that our Invictors from Year 9 to 12 had on a recent visit to this local farm. It was a memorable and educational day full of interesting discoveries and hands-on learning. Here is a taste of the enriching adventure that our students experienced: The branches were steady and upright as if they were absolutely vigilant against the notorious act of the wind.
